

BRIDGE Policy on Open Educational Resources

BRIDGE is committed to:

- 1. disseminating working practice;
- 2. facilitating collaboration; and
- 3. improving the quality of education in South Africa.

As a consequence, BRIDGE is committed to distributing Open Educational Resources (OERs) that can be accessed freely, redistributed, amended and built on.

OERs are educational resources that are freely available for use by school leaders, educators and learners without an accompanying need to pay royalties or licence fees. Creative Commons (CC) licences provide legal mechanisms to:

- 1. ensure that people can retain acknowledgement for their work while allowing it to be shared; and
- 2. seek to restrict commercial activity if they so wish.

BRIDGE has adopted, as a default licence for all its products produced through its various projects and engagements, a Creative Commons Attribution-ShareAlike 4.0 International licence (CC-BY-SA 4.0).

The Creative Commons (CC-BY-SA 4.0) licence has been chosen as it lets other users remix, tweak and build upon work, as long as they give appropriate credit and license their new creations under the identical terms.

All projects that are subject to copyright must be licensed with a Creative Commons CC-Attribution-Share Alike as a default licence unless otherwise included in the terms of contract.

Users are by this means of licensing free to:

- Share copy and redistribute the material in any medium or format; and
- Adapt remix, transform, and build upon the material.

BRIDGE cannot revoke these freedoms as long as users follow these license terms:

- Attribution You must give appropriate credit, provide a link to the licence, and indicate if
 changes were made. You may do so in any reasonable manner, but not in any way that
 suggests the licensor endorses you or your use.
- ShareAlike If you remix, transform, or build upon the material, you must distribute your contributions under the same license as the original.
