This presentation includes characteristics of a resilient school as well as a framework has been created to help build resilience so that schools: are solution instead of problem-orientated; have a strength-based approach focussing on what they do have and not what they do not have; are hardy and have a perspective on the world characterised by a commitment that protects them from harmful effects, and can thrive after stressful events.
