ADVANTAGES OF BLENDED LEARNING

- Effective communication between students and their instructors



DISADVANTAGES OF BLENDED LEARNING

Lack of motivation can make blended learning very difficult, especially when teachers are less sensitive to their learner's cognitive needs

Initially it is a lot difficult for learners to learn basic technology skills on how to take online lessons and complete online assignments

Plagiarism and credibility problems as learners find it to resist the temptation of looking up for answers on the web Teachers get overworked with having to find a balance between managing both online and physical classrooms.
